## New fence and driveway for Logan Artists

Through the kind support of Cr Graham Able, Division Five, Logan Artists premises will soon be sporting a brand new 1.5 m fence along the front of the property with a double gate for car access and a single pedestrian gate. This will replace the broken chain-link fence with the neighbour and the timber bollards and make the property more secure. The present driveway will be replaced with a new concrete driveway.

This is a timely upgrade with several break-ins to our storage sheds within the last couple of weeks. Although the children involved did not do any damage, it is better to have our premises secure before the break-ins escalate.

The pedestrian gate will allow access to neighbours who regularly walk their dogs on the lovely LAA grounds but make it difficult for local rev heads to drive their cars down the back and engage in the pastime of doing wheelies to impress their mates.

In order for the Art and Pottery Studios to remain accessible during this construction work, the driveway will be installed in two stages. Please be aware of the signs and barricades which will be in place during this time.

## Breaking through the blocks

What does an artist fear most? Well, I can't speak for everyone, but for myself it's the blank page partnered with the lack of idea. (Add on a deadline and I'm FROZEN!) What do I do? I look for a prompt or a creative challenge. It's a little like playing charades with yourself though, so I thought I'd have a little fun and give you a list of 14 art prompts to get you through a slew of blank-canvas freeze-ups! (That's enough for 2 whole weeks of inspiration!) I've pulled these ideas from past, current and future issues of Cloth Paper Scissors magazine—a great place to feed your art muse.

1. Be inspired by your breakfast: Use the colors from your cereal box to start your next piece.
2. Use a mirror: Place a mirror on your work surface and make a painting by looking into the mirror.
3. Draw without looking: Draw a still life in a journal with your eyes closed.
4. Make a book: Google book binding and try a new binding technique.
5. Add glitter to something: Try German glitter glass or cut-glass glitter for a vintage look.
6. Create a Packing Tape Transfer: Place a piece of packing tape over a photocopy image and rub off the paper backing with a wet sponge.
7. Use old supplies: Use a supply in your studio that you haven't used in at least 6 months.
8. Make a stencil: Take a picture of your favorite pet (or person) in profile and make a silhouette stencil.
9. Tear it up: Grab an old book and tear it up. See what you can build/cover/create with the pieces.
10. Fold it up: Try a piece of origami, search online for directions. Try it with vintage sheet music or even fabric paper.
11. Go opposite: Use the colors on the opposite side of the color wheel from your go-to palette.
12. Work big: Grab a piece of paper at least twice as big as you usually work on, and stretch yourself.
13. Work small: Sharpen your pencils, and grab your .005 Micron pens and magnifying glass, and work small.
14. Carve it out: Take a moment to make your own artist stamp by carving an eraser with a craft knife.

## Members needed to join Trinder Park Exhibition Group

Several years have passed now since an agreement was made between LAA and Trinder Park to display a few of our members' paintings on the walls of the Rest Home.



It started as a successful trial, followed by donations of several members' paintings to brighten up the walls of the residents' rooms and corridors. The response was so positive that a large Dedication Wall, just inside the entrance to the recreation room, was given to LAA to exhibit member's work. Since then a regular changeover of 15-20 paintings every 3-4 mths has continued.



This has been an ideal opportunity for our members to see their work hung in an area where regular through traffic of residents, staff and visitors can view the paintings. In some cases it may be the first time for new members to have their work hung, perhaps even selling a work. To have one's work and name in the public eye is a wonderful boost to what may be a beginning of a budding art career. But the main reward is the expressions of pleasure we get from the residents and staff each time we hang fresh paintings. Another delight is the conversations we have with the residents who watch and sometimes pass a comment or two. The LAA connection with Trinder Park also extends to the occasional painting or craft lesson to residents who benefit from the social contact and sale of work as a result of these workshops.

However in order to continue, we need two or three more members to volunteer a few hours of their time every 3-4 months to help dismantle the previous display and hang the new paintings. This is also a terrific learning experience for members.
